

Repotting a tomato plant

Things you will need to do this

- A young tomato plant
- Large plant pot
- Compost

Repotting a tomato plant

Step 1. Put some compost into the bottom of the big plant pot.



Step 2. Gently tip your tomato plant over and take it out of its pot.



Step 3. Put your plant into the bigger pot.



Step 4. Fill the plant pot with compost, making sure all the roots are covered. Then continue to fill around the plant.
(see the picture below)

Gently firm down the compost with your fingers being careful not to snap the stem.



Don't forget to water it once you've finished.

Put your plant in the windowsill or in a very sunny spot in the garden.

Remember it is important not to water your tomato plant too much!

Little and often.
