Priority 1	Communication mentoring across KS2 and 3 for all disadvantaged pupils that are pre-using speech or at the early stages of speech.
Priority 2	High quality Phonics teaching and support from KS1 through to KS4.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Diverse needs, abilities and starting points for children.
Projected spending	£32,000

Wider strategies for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	Triage, signpost to and support with children's families to access local authority, community or school-based services that can build the opportunities for children to access education, stay safe and take part in broader opportunities.
Priority 2	Enhance the Sharing and Supporting Learning with Families Programme to develop two-way communication with a child's household to develop wider knowledge and use of skills.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Restricted opportunities for families to interact with school in ways that can effectively share this type of information and detail. Variations in attendance often relating to access to wider services, e.g. school transport, respiratory physio, Complex Health Nursing Team support.
Projected spending	£25,000

Targeted support	Ensuring enough time for school Communication Intervention Lead to plan and assess personalised strategies with individuals and small groups	Communication lead paired with part-time teacher 3 days a week to plan and assess personalised strategies with individuals and small groups
Wider strategies	Enough time to plan and deliver new programme of careers activity	Lead teacher now supported by two assistants
